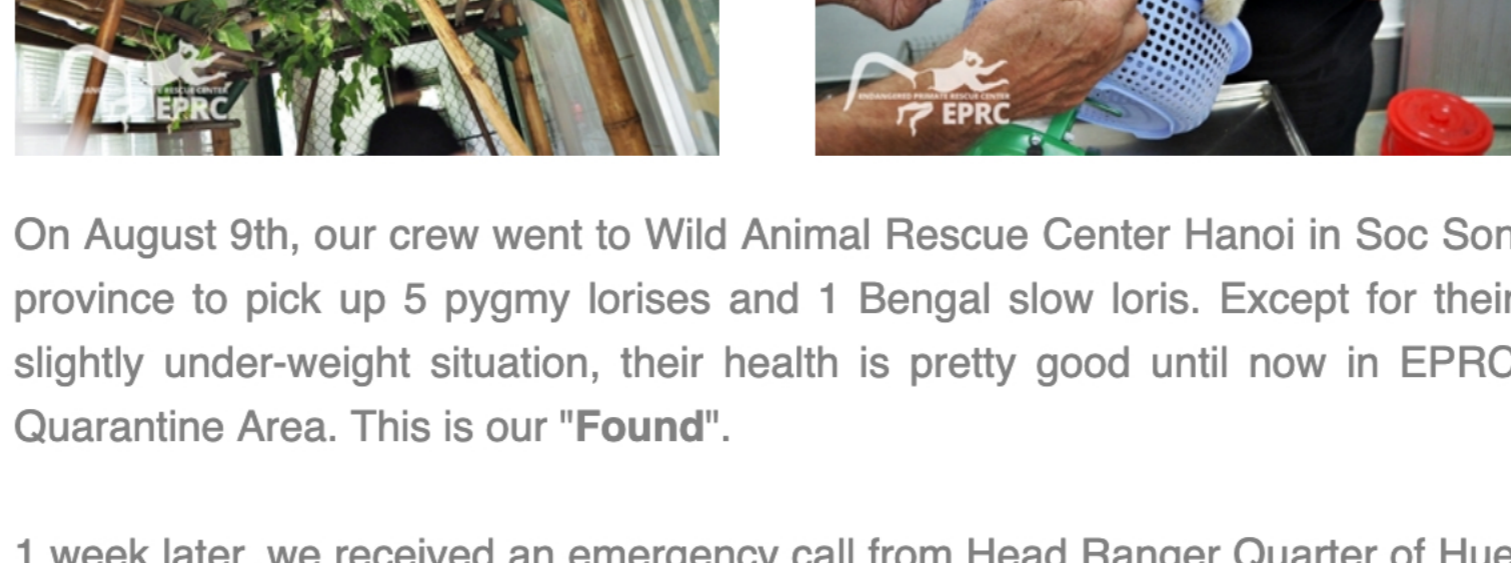
### The Month of Found and Lost

CP the Delacour's langur was found to be holding a live toad! She kept the toad unharmed for 2 days and then released the animal. We suspect that she will deliver a baby soon or maybe she wants to have a baby :D

### 7 Primates arrived at EPRC!



On August 9th, our crew went to Wild Animal Rescue Center Hanoi in Soc Son province to pick up 5 pygmy lorises and 1 Bengal slow loris. Except for their slightly under-weight situation, their health is pretty good until now in EPRC Quarantine Area. This is our "Found".

1 week later, we received an emergency call from Head Ranger Quarter of Hue city in Phu Loc district about an injured Red-shanked douc langur. Right in that night, we headed to Hue city and transported the douc langur back to EPRC within 48 hours. Unfortunately, we had to farewell him after 1,5 weeks because of this worsening health condition. This is our "Lost". After a careful necropsy, it confirmed our suspicion that he was kept captive in such a bad condition that his body didn't even have any fat.

Please STAND UP and say NO to keeping wild animals as pets!

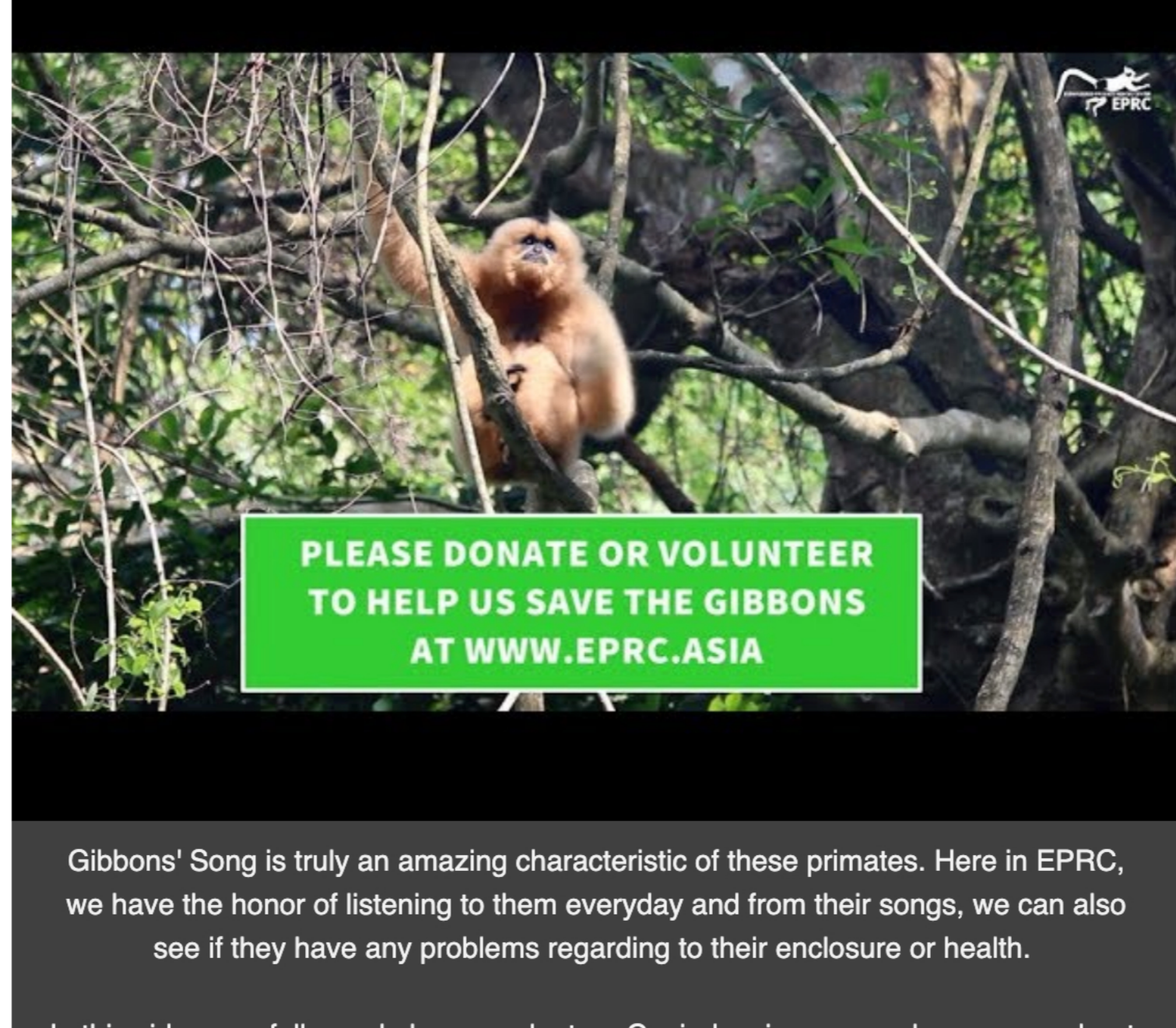
### Hi There Little Douc Langur Girl!

### Dr. Bonnie Raphael is BACK!

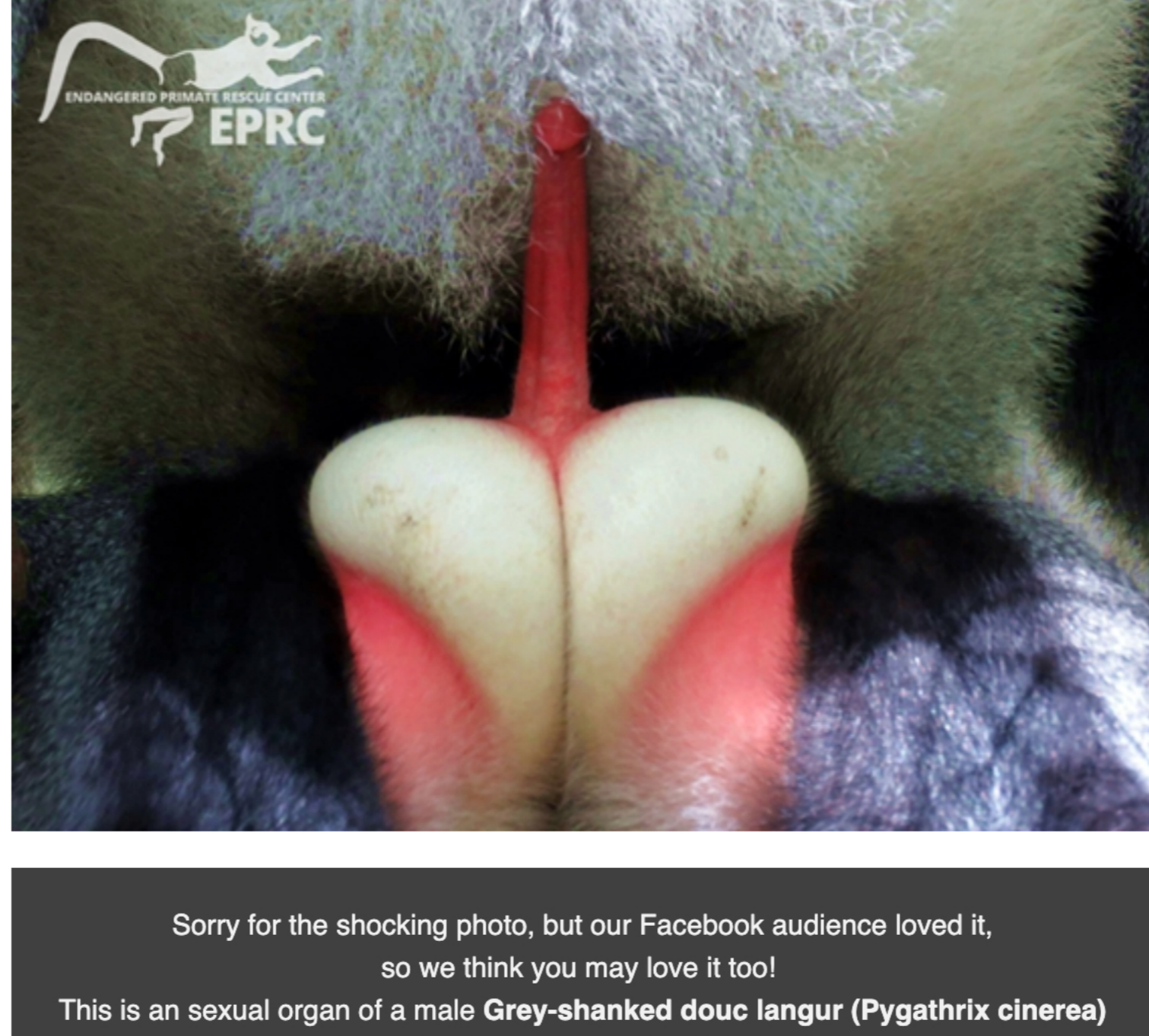
